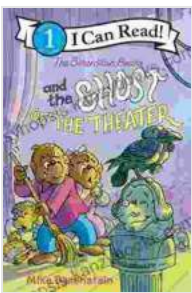


Book Review: The Berenstain Bears Read with Me Book: The Berenstain Bears and the Ghost of the Theater

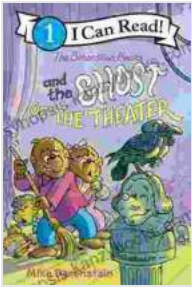

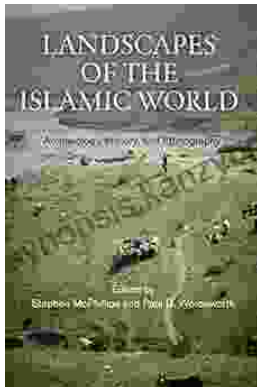

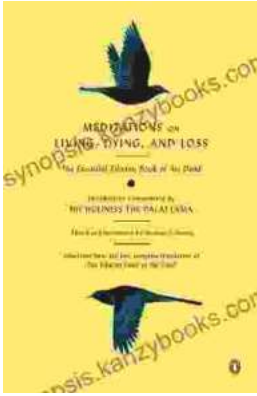
